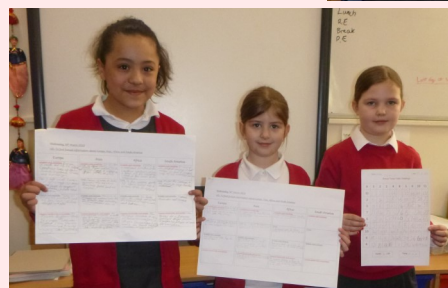
Upper Juniors looking back at last week
